## Exports increased in the first half of 2023, imports decreased slightly

Trade balance somewhat positive in June 2023

Vienna, 2023-09-07 — According to preliminary results from Statistics Austria, exports of goods increased in June 2023 by 3.4% to €17.34 bn. At the same time, the value of imports of goods amounted to €17.26 bn, a decrease of 2.4% compared to June 2022. The trade balance showed an activum of €0.07 bn.

"Austria achieved a trade surplus for the second time this year. In June, the sharp decline in the import value of gas and the increase in exports of machinery and vehicles were mainly responsible for the fact that the value of exports exceeded that of imports by 71 million. Exports of road vehicles in particular increased significantly: Here, the export value grew by 15.1% compared to June of the previous year, with a volume increase of 4.3%. At the same time, the import value of gas slumped by more than half due to price factors, with a simultaneous increase in volume of 21.3%," says Statistics Austria Director General Tobias Thomas

Austria imported goods worth €11.27 bn from **European Union member states** in **June 2023**, and goods worth €11.76 bn were exported to these countries. Compared to June 2022, intra-EU imports decreased by 6.7% and intra-EU exports increased by 2.6%. This resulted in a positive trade balance with European Union member states of €0.49 bn.

Imports from **non-EU countries** amounted to  $\le$ 6.00 bn in June 2023, showing an increase of 6.8% year-on-year; extra-EU exports increased by 4.9% to  $\le$ 5.57 bn. The resulting passivum in trade balance with non-EU countries amounted to  $\le$ 0.42 bn (see table 1).

The four **most important product groups** in Austria's international trade – machinery and vehicles, processed goods, chemical products and other manufactured goods – together showed an increase of 3.9% to €14.70 bn on the export side. The largest absolute export growth in this group was achieved by machinery and vehicles (+13.4%; +€0.81 bn), with the subgroup road vehicles showing particularly strong growth here (+15.1%; +€0.23 bn). On the import side, the four most important product groups together showed an increase of 2.2% to €13.66 bn. Within this group, machinery and vehicles (+9.2%; +€0.51 bn) recorded the strongest absolute increase in imports, followed by other manufactured goods (+10.9%, +€0.24 bn).

Apart from the four most important product groups, fuel and energy recorded the largest absolute declines (−31.2%; −€0.60 bn) in imports. Here, the gas subgroup recorded a decrease of 51.2% in value, while at the same time the volume increased by 21.3%. The subgroup petroleum and petroleum products showed a decline of 17.3% in value, with an increase of 45.5% in import volume.

## First half of 2023: imports down 0.2%, exports up 5.9%

The total value of imports of goods in the period **January to June 2023** was nominally  $\le$ 105.59 bn, according to preliminary results from Statistics Austria, while exports of goods amounted to  $\le$ 102.17 bn. In the period January to June 2023, imports decreased by 0.2% and exports increased by 5.9%. The trade balance deficit showed a value of  $\le$ 3.42 bn, compared to  $\le$ 9.32 bn in the same period the year before.

From January to June 2023, trade with all of the ten most important import partners, except Switzerland (+9.2%), the United States (+32.9%) and France (+9.4%), showed decreases on the import side. Besides the decrease with Germany, Austria's most important trading partner (-2.0%), main decreases were recorded with China (-3.9%), Italy (-3.6%) and Czech Republic (-4.4%). On the export side, the ten most important

export partners – except Italy (–5.3%), Hungary (–5.1%) and Poland (–0.5%) – recorded increases, in particular Germany (+7.5%), Belgium (+104.8%) and the United States (+13.7%).

Austria imported goods worth €67.45 bn (-2.5%) from **European Union member states** from January to June 2023. The value of goods exported to EU countries recorded an increase of +5.5% compared to the same period of the previous year and amounted to €70.50 bn. The positive trade balance with the European Union amounted to €3.05 bn, compared to a deficit of €2.37 bn in the period January to June 2022.

International trade of goods with **third countries** showed an increase in both imports (+4.2% to €38.14 bn) and exports (+6.9% to €31.67 bn) compared to the same period last year. This resulted in a trade balance passivum with third countries of €6.47 bn (see table 2).

In the period January to June 2023, imports from **Ukraine** decreased by 2.4% compared to the same period before the start of the war (January to June 2021) to €0.53 bn. The main import product group was metalliferous ores and metal scrap. On the export side, however, an increase of 10.7% to €0.32 bn was recorded, with medical and pharmaceutical products as the most important product group.

On the import side, trade with the **Russian Federation** showed a significant increase (+50.5% to €2.41 bn) compared to the same period in 2021 before the start of the war with Ukraine, with gas being the most important import commodity. On the export side, there was a decrease by 25.8% to €0.72 bn. The most important group was medical and pharmaceutical products.

With an import share of 7.4% (€7.85 bn) in January to June 2023 and an export share of 2.5% (€2.52 bn), the People's Republic of **China** was one of Austria's most important trading partners, as in previous years. Imports decreased only slightly by 3.9% compared to the period January to June 2022, but the decline in exports was higher at over 6.5%. In terms of imports, the country took second place after Germany, while in terms of exports it was only in eleventh place. This resulted in by far the highest trade deficit (€5.32 bn) with a trading partner. The main import item was electrical machinery and equipment, while the most important export item was industrial machinery.

Information on methodology, definitions: The available result of the foreign trade statistics (ITGS: International Trade in Goods Statistics) contains data of the statistics of the trade in goods with third countries (EXTRASTAT) associated with the customs declaration and the primary statistics of the trade in goods with the EU member states (INTRASTAT) as well as additional estimates on the INTRASTAT data collected, which cover the non-response to the survey and values not collected due to thresholds. Foreign trade statistics usually take into account the physical movement of goods that cross the Austrian border.
